An educator's guide is available and focuses on the abstract as it applies to dance, jazz music and poetry. The Middle School ballet is an ensemble work and has no narrative. Available late March through May.

BIG CITY BOP

Nashville Ballet 2's new ballet designed especially for grades 5-8, exposes students to the art of dance in an abstract form. Students will learn to look at a non-story ballet for the quality of its movement, the feelings that are conveyed, and the use of music as it relates to the theme of the piece. Using the original Bebop score by James Spinazzola, Director of Instrumental Studies at the University of Indianapolis, choreographer Kathleen Spinnazzola will look at the theme of the hero next door in a fast-paced urban environment. Inspired by recent global tragedies, she will show the humanity in all of us in the face of great catastrophe. A study guide will be available for participating middle schools that will focus on the history of jazz, modern dance, and urban studies, and also include curriculum-based lessons that incorporate dance and music.
