The purpose of the Capital Campaign Report is to:

- announce new campaigns to local funders;
- give donors an update on funds raised-to-date in ongoing capital campaigns;
- provide information on recently completed campaigns;
- share preliminary plans for capital campaigns in the next three years; and
- note trends over time in Middle Tennessee.

A capital campaign is defined as a fundraising effort beyond annual operating or program budgets, which is focused on the purchase of a permanent asset (land, building, major equipment) or a major renovation project. Endowment campaigns may also be part of a capital campaign.

This year's report includes details from **64 organizations that self-reported involvement in current capital campaigns**, as well as how much was raised in **25 campaigns that were completed in 2024**.

Additionally, there are 267 campaigns that are expected to be launched in the next three years.

In a key breakthrough in April 2022, our landlord generously donated to FAF our 20,000 square-foot building and the 5 acres of land on which it sits, at an appraised value of \$2.5 million, to complete the first two phases of our Capital Campaign. FAF has used that property as collateral to finance a note of \$1.875 million, so that we could engage Refrigerated Warehousing, Inc. of Jasper, GA, to complete Phase 3 by constructing an 8,400 square-foot cooler/freezer. The project is scheduled to break ground in July 2022.
