



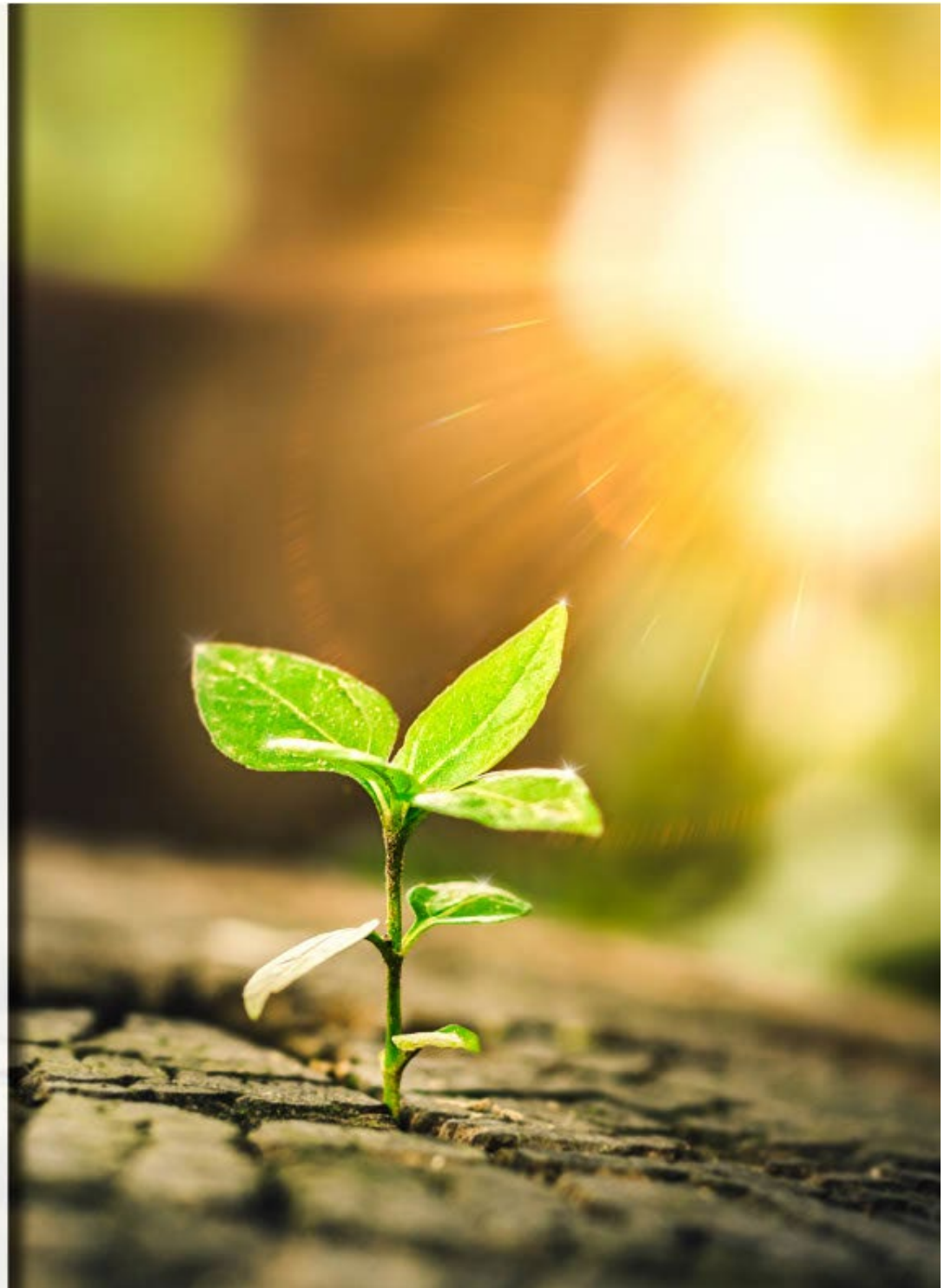

2026 GivingMatters.com Capital Campaign Report

Since 2007, GivingMatters.com has produced a **Capital Campaign Report** to further the program’s mission of informing and enriching philanthropy in Middle Tennessee. As the platform has evolved over time, this report has continued to serve as a resource highlighting active capital campaigns submitted by nonprofits across the region.

This edition reflects information collected from participating organizations through GivingMatters.com and includes campaigns reported by 820 nonprofits throughout Middle Tennessee at the time of publication.

The purpose of the Capital Campaign Report is to:

- announce new campaigns to local funders;
- give donors an update on funds raised-to-date in ongoing capital campaigns;
- provide information on recently completed campaigns;
- share preliminary plans for capital campaigns in the next three years; and
- note trends over time in Middle Tennessee.

A capital campaign is defined as a fundraising effort beyond annual operating or program budgets, which is focused on the purchase of a permanent asset (land, building, major equipment) or a major renovation project. Endowment campaigns may also be part of a capital campaign.

This year’s report includes details from **90 organizations that self-reported involvement in current capital campaigns**, as well as how much was raised in **13 campaigns that were completed in 2025**.

Additionally, there are **279 campaigns that are expected to be launched in the next three years**.
